King David is under attack, cried out to God, recognizing the feeling <u>as if</u> God was not listening. Yet, as he writes this psalm to reassure himself and God's people that God listens: a message that will be echoed for generations to come. 	 Self-reflection. ⊕ If my God is a <u>God who listens</u>, what difference does it make in my life?
 START with Him (verses 1-3): David starts with God because he knew that God reign supremely over his life. 	a) What is our attitude towards God? Do we only turn to God as our <u>last</u> lifeline when we've exhausted all other options?
 2.TRUST in Him (verses 4–7): David trusts not only in God's character but also in His covenant. 	b) Can we honestly still trust God's character and his covenant when we're being attacked by evildoers?
 3.FOLLOW Him (verses 8–10): David is following God and he wants Him to lead him in what He declares is right. 	c) Can we say, like David, that we want to see the clear path God intends us to follow so that we do not wonder off the straight and narrow path?
 4. PRAISE Him (verses 11-12) David reflects about how God protects and bless the righteous person, he erupts in praise. The Hebrew word <u>praise</u>, <i>hālal</i> (הָלַל) simply means to boast. Who do you brag about, reflects who your God actually is? 	d) When was the last time you boasted about the God who listens?
Onote that self-reflection questions "a" and "d" reflect our posture towards God (Matthew 6:21).	Self-examination "in" our hearts.
 C. CONCLUSION. IMAGINE How the Church of Jesus Christ would looks so <i>distinctively</i> <i>different</i>, only if God's people were boasting about the God who listens? 	 Maybe, the reason why our world is in the situation where it is right now, is because God's people are too busy bragging about our <i>little</i> "g" (gods) in our own lives. Instead cultivate the <i>habitus</i> "to boast in the Lord" (2 Corinthians 10:17).
